

## TRANSPORTATION PROGRAMS

*Community Transit of Delaware County provides discounted shared ride door-to-door transportation services for Delaware County residents of all ages!*

**Medical Assistance Transportation Program** for ACCESS card holders of all ages. FREE transportation to approved medical facilities.

**PwD** Transportation for people with disabilities, age 18 to 64 who need transportation from an area not serviced by existing transportation services.

### **SEPTA Customized Community Transportation (CCT)**

SEPTA provides this service to individuals who are functionally unable to use regular fixed route transportation for some or all of their mobility needs. Community Transit is the subcontractor to SEPTA in Delaware County.

### **Shared Ride Program**

The Senior Citizen's Shared Ride Program is a reduced fare transportation program available to riders who are willing to share their trip with other passengers. Persons 65 years of age or older are entitled to receive these trips and pay only 15% of the reduced shared ride fares. Passengers share a vehicle with other riders, so trips may take longer than riding in a private automobile. We may need to ask you to adjust your appointment times to ensure on-time arrival for everyone. All trips must originate within Delaware County and Community Transit will transport passengers anywhere within Delaware County. Out of county trips to destinations such as Philadelphia, Lankenau Hospital, etc., are available on a more limited basis, as capacity and ride sharing allow. Basic service is from the curb of a passenger's pick up location to the curb of their destination. Door-to-door service may be provided if necessary and it is requested in advance. ### **How to qualify:**

You must be at least 65 years of age and complete a registration form and return it to Community Transit along with one of the following types of proof of age: A photocopy of:

- Birth or baptismal certificate

- State issued Driver's license
- PA Photo Identification Card
- INS Resident Alien Card
- Veteran's Universal Access ID Card
- Armed forces discharge papers
- PACE or PACENET Card
- Passport or Naturalization Papers

*We cannot accept your Medicare Card.*

### **How do I arrange for my trips?**

When you receive your rider ID card, you may begin scheduling your trips by calling 610-490-3960 or our TTY line for the hearing impaired at 610-490-3990. Trip requests are accepted up to two weeks in advance. Community Transit will accept trip requests up to 12 noon one day in advance, as availability permits. All trips are reserved on a first-come, first-served basis and rides are available as capacity and ride sharing allow. When you call, please be prepared to provide:

- Your name
- Address of pick up point
- Entrance location, if applicable
- Time of pick up
- Your destination, including a phone number where we may reach you
- Any special needs.

### **Medical Assistance Transportation Program (MATP)**

The Medical Assistance Transportation Program (MATP) provides transportation to medical services for Medical Assistance (MA) consumers. The type of transportation provided is that which is the least expensive while still meeting the consumer's needs. The assistance available may be tickets or tokens to ride public transportation, mileage reimbursement for use of a private car, or paratransit services (for example, in a Community Transit bus). Transportation can be provided to any Medical Assistance approved provider including: physicians, dentists, health clinics, podiatrists, rural health clinics, hospice programs, physical therapists, outpatient services, pharmacies, drug and alcohol clinics, mental health centers, outpatient rehab services, optometrists, dialysis clinics, psychologists, and ambulatory surgical services. Applicants will receive written notice that their application has been approved and what mode of transportation for which they have been approved. ## **PwD**

The Persons with Disabilities Program (PwD) is a reduced fare transportation program available to residents of Delaware County who are between the ages of 18 and 64 and have a documented disability, either temporary or permanent. The PwD Program cannot be used in place of trips that are currently sponsored by other existing programs, such as SEPTA CCT or local human service agencies. Before registering for PwD through Community Transit, you must first submit an application to SEPTA's CCT Program by calling 215-580-7145. Passengers share a vehicle with other riders, so trips may take longer than riding in a private automobile. We may need to ask you to adjust your appointment times to ensure on-time arrival for everyone. All trips must originate within Delaware County and Community Transit will transport passengers anywhere within Delaware County. Out of county trips to destinations such as Philadelphia, Lankenau Hospital, etc., are available on a more limited basis, as capacity and ride sharing allow. Basic service is from the curb of a passenger's pick up location to the curb of their destination. Door-to-door service may be provided if necessary and it is requested in advance. ## **SEPTA Customized Community Transportation (CCT)**

Community Transit of Delaware County, Inc. is the subcontractor to SEPTA in Delaware County and provides transportation under SEPTA's Customized Community Transportation service. This service provides trips to customers registered with SEPTA on a space-available basis. This service is provided door-to-door by advance reservations, with limited driver assistance. SEPTA provides this service to individuals who are functionally unable to use regular fixed route transportation for some or all of their mobility needs. Eligible individuals can travel whenever and wherever SEPTA's fixed route transportation operates.
